# A message from our Principal

Dear Parents, Carers and Families,

As Term 4 draws to a close, I want to extend my thanks to all members of our school community for their support, energy and commitment over the past six weeks.

This final week before the Easter break has been a vibrant and inspiring one. It has been packed with highlights that reflect the depth and richness of school life at The Abbey. Our students have shone in a range of settings: from the exceptional performances in the Year 11 Drama and Dance practical exams, to the pride and celebration of our year group Prize Giving events. These moments have been a reminder of the talent, resilience and spirit that define our young people.

We've also seen our MFL trip to Barcelona, giving students a fantastic cultural and linguistic experience abroad. Our Prize Giving events gave us the chance to honour the dedication and growth of our students as they progress on their shared learning journey.

Behind the scenes, our staff continue to work tirelessly to keep everything running smoothly - from safeguarding and attendance to curriculum planning and budget preparation. I remain deeply grateful to them for their dedication.

Looking ahead, we return in Term 5 revitalised and re-energised. For our Year 11 and Year 13 students, there are now only a small number of school days remaining before the May exams begin. Attendance at these sessions will now be monitored even more closely, and we will be using both our rewards and sanctions systems to ensure maximum engagement in the run-up to the exams. I encourage Y11 parents and carers to look at the separate message that has been sent about this that clarifies the arrangements for after the Easter holidays.

Term 5 begins with an INSET day on Tuesday 22nd April, and students return on Wednesday 23rd April. I encourage all students to use the break to recharge, reflect, and come back ready to make every moment count.

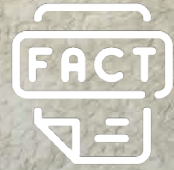

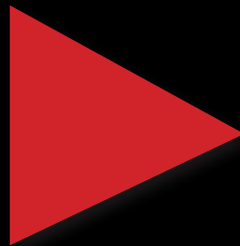

# PASTORAL SPOTLIGHT ON... THE WIDER ABBEY SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Here at school, your children will see many people as they move through the day.

Wearing our dark blue or purple lanyards, students will see teachers, cover supervisors, teaching assistants, pastoral, safeguarding, SRP, reflection and PEC staff.

They will also regularly see our premises team and our cleaning team, the canteen staff and the office and attendance teams.

We have lots of regular external visitors too, who may wear a red or a green lanyard.

We have members of the Emotional Wellbeing Team in school most days – they are part of the NHS and work with our students to support wellbeing.

We have regular visits from our child-centred police officer, PC Amy Tyler – you may see her police patrol car outside school. PC Tyler comes to advise, support and offer a friendly face to our students.

We have external speakers who may deliver an assembly or a workshop in the hall.

We have regular visits from the NHS Immunisation Teams, to deliver vaccinations.

We have visitors in school from the Howard Trust – these are people who support in the organisation and running of our school.

We all have visitors from Social Services, Kent Connexions, and invigilators.

We have external teachers who come into provide music lessons for our students.

We have Reverend Dan in school for assemblies and to provide advice and support.

Here at The Abbey we aim to provide a welcoming, enriching and safe space, and our visitors help us to do this. We welcome visitors who provide a valuable link to the wider Faversham community.

3:45pm – 5pm 8-11 years  
(Primary)

5:15pm – 6:30pm 11+ years  
(Secondary)

The aim of the sessions is to give young something to do; we will be working with our local police officer and the child centred police team to try to reduce anti-social behaviour in the area.

Our local officer may attend some of the sessions to meet with and get to know the young people and he will give me names of any young people that are not allowed to take part each week due to their behaviour around the village. No need to pre-book but we will need to take names, D.O.B and emergency contact details.

Young people at some point may take part in archery, axe throwing, low ropes, assault course, team building, climbing, abseiling, high ropes, zip-line, survival skills, crossbows, orienteering, catapults and more

# Consideration In The Community

Most of you are wonderful ambassadors of the school through your kind and considerate actions towards others in our local community, especially when travelling to and from school.

Remember its **not fair** for anyone to be allowed to deliberately make life miserable for others. **We will never tolerate nasty behaviour or bullying towards those in our school community.** Always ask an adult for help if you are being treated unkindly or if you feel frustrated about the ways others are treating you.

## DO

**Move aside** on the pavement to allow to use it.

**Speak using appropriate tone and at a sensible level** to those you are with, using language that is not offensive or swearing.

**Cross roads safely**, using the bridge to navigate the A2 and by looking up and checking the traffic for all other streets where there are no pedestrian crossing facilities

## DO NOT

**Monopolise the whole pavement** space by walking in a group forcing elderly, those with prams or indeed anyone from the community into the road.

**Shriek, shout, threaten or swear to those around you**, be they friends, members of the public or students who attend other schools - this is intimidating behaviour brings our school into disrepute and this will be followed up and dealt with.

**Run across the A2**, this is a busy road with TWO speed cameras on it for a reason - the number of accidents. **DO NOT** become a statistic (injured or worse). Do not walk out directly in front of cars and expect them to stop.

**What Parents & Educators Need to Know about INSTAGRAM**

Instagram remains one of the world's most popular social media platforms, especially among teens – with almost 70% of 13 to 17-year-olds using it. Owned by Meta, Instagram allows users to share photos and videos, create interactive 'stories', broadcast live, and private messages and follow others. With regular updates and new features, it's essential for parents and educators to stay informed about how children are using the app – and what the risks are.

**WHAT ARE THE RISKS?**

- EXCESSIVE SCREEN TIME**  
Instagram's design encourages prolonged use through endless scrolling content and gamified features like reels and stories. Children can easily spend hours of their free time on the app, which can impact their sleep, academic performance, and mental health.
- AI CHATBOT CONCERNS**  
Meta's AI, which is embedded in Instagram, allows users to chat with an AI 'persona' that often lacks the ability to understand context and nuance. Children may be misled by these chatbots, which can provide false information and encourage risky behavior.
- RISKS OF GOING LIVE**  
The live streaming feature allows users to broadcast content in real-time to their followers. This increases the risk of unwanted attention, cyberbullying, and exposure to inappropriate content. Parents should monitor their child's live streaming activity and ensure they have appropriate privacy settings.
- EXCLUSION AND LOW SELF-WORTH**  
Seeing what others have achieved or posted can lead to feelings of exclusion and low self-worth. Children may compare themselves to others and feel inadequate or jealous.
- SET BOUNDARIES FOR THREADS AND AI**  
Threads content on Instagram also applies to Threads. These allow parents to monitor their child's activity, check for inappropriate content, block AI features, and monitor their child's interactions with AI-generated content.
- BE MEDIA-SAVVY WITH INFLUENCERS**  
Parents should educate their children on the risks of following influencers. Children may be misled by influencers who promote unrealistic expectations and unhealthy behaviors.

**Advice for Parents & Educators**

- USE INSTAGRAM'S SUPERVISION TOOLS**  
Instagram's built-in Family Center lets parents monitor their child's activity. This includes monitoring their child's posts, stories, and messages. Parents should ensure their child's account is set to private and that they have appropriate privacy settings.
- OPEN UP THE CONVERSATION**  
Talk to your child about the risks of using Instagram and encourage them to share their experiences. Encourage them to report any inappropriate content or behavior to the app's moderators.

Dr. Sarah Johnson, a child safety consultant, educator, and researcher who has developed and implemented anti-bullying and cyberbullying programs in schools. She has written several research papers and presented at national and international conferences.
